

Sports Premium at Capenhurst CE Primary School – September 2016

The purpose of the Sports Premium grant is to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of pupils aged 5-11 years old in this academic year, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles.

The Education Funding Agency (EFA) has agreed a final allocation of £8,000 per eligible school plus £5 per pupil. Capenhurst CE Primary School was awarded £8,200 for 2015/16.

During 2015/16, Capenhurst CE Primary School has used its allocation of £8200 to enhance and improve our P.E. and sport provision in the following ways:

- Class based sports teaching for each class delivered by a qualified sports coach provided by Premier Sport which is well planned, children regularly assessed and information is shared with class teachers
- Extra-curricular clubs led by the coach and observed by school staff to support their professional development
- Participation in interschool sports events both children in both key stages
- Enrichment days for all pupils covering a range of physical activities
- Lunchtime play supervision for vulnerable pupils
- Sports based professional development with staff from other local schools that will build network links for staff alongside enhance their P.E. teaching
- Swimming teacher and life guard for children in KS2 to receive at least 10 swimming lessons per year of 1 hour

The quality of provision was monitored through joint observations of lessons delivered by the sports coach by the head teacher and the area co-ordinator of Premier Sport. The impact of the above measures led to children showing increased stamina when swimming in upper key stage 2 due 1 hour lessons; increased confidence in the water for lower key stage 2 pupils due to smaller adult to child ration at the pool; children being introduced to a variety of sports through after school activities; participation in interschool events for children in both key stages; play makers gave upper key stage 2 pupils the chance to develop leadership skills and positive play experiences for vulnerable children at lunchtime.

Following a review of last year's provision, the allocation of £8,200 for 2016/17 will be used in the following ways:

- Class based sports teaching for each class delivered by a qualified sports coach provided by Premier Sport which is well planned, children regularly assessed and information is shared with class teachers
- Extra-curricular clubs led by the coach and observed by school staff to support their professional development
- Participation in interschool sports events both children in both key stages
- Enrichment days for all pupils covering a range of physical activities

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In terms of future sustainability, provision will be made in the following academic years for staff to work alongside coaches in order to develop their own skills in terms of P.E. teaching and bespoke professional development days to enhance the delivery of P.E. by class teachers across school.

The long term aim is higher quality lessons and improved learning for all children with increased opportunities for quality professional development opportunities for staff through attendance at training courses and team teaching alongside qualified sports coaches.

When Capenhurst was inspected by Ofsted in June 2015, they reviewed the use this spending and made the following comments:

'The school uses the additional primary school sport funding successfully. ... This is having a positive impact on pupils' physical well-being and healthy lifestyles.'
