Ofsted

As you are aware the window of opportunity for a return visit of Ofsted grows ever smaller (they are due back before May 2015). As part of the inspection process, the opinion of parents and families are sought through Parent View. I feel that school is a very different place than the responses currently held on Parent View would indicate, your questionnaire returns in February 2014 also support this view. As such, I would ask that you visit the Parent View site and update the responses. For those of you unfamiliar with the site, it is very user friendly and the survey takes only a short time to complete but can make a real difference to how school is perceived prior to the inspection. School lunches

After reviewing the school meal option replies that everyone sent in and sharing them with our school meals providers, we were informed that we could not offer sandwiches as an alternative and variations to the set menus were not permitted. The children took part in an online survey in school and the four weekly rolling menu was selected from their preferred options. School lunches cost £2.15 for children in Y3 and above. Children in EYFS, Y1 or Y2 can receive a free school meal from 1st September 2014.
