New School


We have now raised enough funds (many Thanks to all supporters of Little Faces) to finally give the go ahead for the new school to be built.

LIFE IN KENYA

Drought:- Kenya has declared the ongoing drought affecting many parts of the country a national disaster, calling for aid to counter the situation which is posing a major risk to people, livestock and wildlife. The drought is now into its third year and although there has been some rain it has not yet been enough



replenish the water reserves, as a result food prices still continue to rise;

Kenyan elections:- With a second election being held with only one candidate (opposition refused to take part) the country is in a volatile mood. After violence and protest during the last election the government ordered that all schools must close on the 24th. October and will not re-open until the New Year. Little Faces School have had to rush through the graduation ceremony and gift presentation to the children. With the school being closed this puts a further strain on parents as children are not being fed at the school and are reliant on parents for food.

<u>Health Risk</u>:- Kenya has been put on high alert by the World Health Organisation along with other East African countries as a result of outbreaks of airborne plague in Madagascar, as yet no cases have been reported in Kenya but because of movement between the two countries the situation must be closely monitored.
