...we have looked at the symbol of the cross and what it can represent in different situations. A cross at the bottom of a card is seen as a kiss, a symbol of love. On a treasure map, the 'x' marks the spot where the treasure can be found. A cross is also a symbol of how Jesus died to make good our mistakes. All of these symbols can be linked to the Christian faith - God shows his love in many ways; he sees everyone as precious and people to be treasured; he allowed his son to die on a cross to take away the sins of people and offer them forgiveness. Swimming Lessons for Class 3

School Meal Price Increase

We have been advised by Edsential, our school meal provider, that the price of a school dinner will be increasing by 27p from 1st April 2024. As a school, we will try to absorb some of that cost and therefore, the new price we will charge will be £3.05 per meal from Monday 15th April, after the Easter holidays. Children in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 will still qualify for a universal infant free school meal.

Selfless Shelves supporting the West Cheshire Foodbank - All in, bring a tin! We think that Capenhurst is a **†O** welcoming community that includes everyone irrespective of race, gender or religion. The 'Selfless



Shelves' is a project where children can earn a token as a reward for a good deed in school. This token can then be exchanged for a food item from the 'Selfless Shelves' which can then be placed in the Foodbank. Everyone is encouraged to bring items for the shelves - the children see this as a 'Circle of Kindness'. We encourage families to help out over the next few days by bringing in things for the Selfless Shelves. All in, bring a tin!

The Foodbank will then use these items to support local families struggling to provide food for themselves. We will continue to support the West Cheshire Foodbank in our traditional way and food items can be brought in and placed on the 'Selfless Shelves' or directly into the collection box. The Foodbank is particularly in need of UHT Juice, instant mash, tinned fruit and tinned meats/meat meals.
