

# Reminder - LFD Test required on Wednesday morning for KS2 children attending the residential

As per the letter sent last week - and particularly in light of the positive covid case notified at the weekend - please ensure that your child takes a LFD test on Wednesday morning (and wait for the result) before attending school. If the test is positive you should inform school immediately by emailing us at <a href="mailto:contact@capenhurstcep.cheshire.sch.uk">contact@capenhurstcep.cheshire.sch.uk</a> and your child should remain at home. This will ensure that we are taking all precautions necessary to help us keep everyone safe and well during the residential. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

# Comic Relief Day - Friday 18th March

Friday 18th March is Comic Relief Day! We are asking those children and staff who are not going on the KS2 residential to join together to embrace and celebrate the Power of Kindness by coming to school dressed as a Super Hero! Their hero could be one from a comic book, TV programme, celebrity or someone in their life who is a Superhero in their eyes.

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Covid updates - there are a few!

## Symptoms/positive cases:

Staff and pupils should not come in to school if they have symptoms. **ALL** those with symptoms will be asked to take a PCR test as per the current guidance.

Staff and pupils should not come in to school if they have a positive test result. They should remain at home for at least 5 days, then complete 2 LFD tests (day 5 and 6) and can return once two consecutive, negative test results have been achieved and shared with school.

If children develop symptoms in school, they will be sent home and you will be asked to book a PCR test. If you choose not to book a test, then it will be treated as a positive case and you will be asked to keep your child at home for at least 5 days.

In most cases, families will agree that a pupil with the key symptoms of COVID-19 should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others. If a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending school where they have a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, school can take the decision to refuse the pupil if, in reasonable judgement, it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19.

### Contacts of cases:

From 24<sup>th</sup> February, guidance for schools remains as before.

Household contacts no longer need to complete 7 day LFD testing but it would be advisable. If LFD tests are positive, isolate for at least 5 days then do LFD testing for 2 days (day 5 and 6) and return to school if both are negative. Please continue to share results of tests with school so that we can continue to monitor transmission within school.

# Selfless Shelves supporting the West Cheshire Foodbank

The children of class 4 think Capenhurst is a welcoming community that includes everyone irrespective of race, gender or religion. The 'Selfless Shelves' is a project where children can earn a token as a reward for a good deed in school. This token can then be exchanged for a food item from the 'Selfless Shelves' which can then be placed in the Foodbank. Everyone is encouraged to bring items for the shelves - the children see this as a 'Circle of Kindness'. The Foodbank will then use these items to support local families struggling to provide food for themselves.



We will continue to support the West Cheshire Foodbank in our traditional way and food items can be brought in and placed on the 'Selfless Shelves' or directly into the collection box. The Foodbank is particularly in need of tinned meats, tinned fish, UHT milk, UHT juice, tinned desserts, custard, instant coffee (small jars), jams and spreads, instant mash/tinned potatoes, pasta sauce, instant pasta/noodles.
