Young Voices - Thursday 26th May

The children who are taking part in Young Voices on Thursday 26th May, may come to school wearing dark jeans (no holes please) or black leggings and either their YV tshirt or a plain white tshirt. The children will have an early lunch (school dinner or packed lunch from home) before we leave for Manchester at 12:15pm. The children will be accompanied by Mrs Ritson, Mrs Haimes, Mrs Forster and Mrs Bunting.

Each child will also need to bring an afternoon snack, a packed tea and an evening snack, as well as plenty of drinks (no fizzy drinks or glass bottles). No rucksacks will be allowed into the arena so please ensure your child brings a disposable carrier bag or drawstring bag.

We anticipate that we will be back at school by 10.30/11pm, but will send a message by ParentMail when we are approx 20 minutes away. Please ensure that school is aware of any changes to emergency contact details well before next week.



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Updated guidance about general childhood illnesses and on-going covid-19 infections.

The list of symptoms for Covid-19, flu and common respiratory infections include:

- continuous cough
- high temperature, fever or chills
- loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell
- shortness of breath
- unexplained tiredness, lack of energy
- muscle aches or pains that are not due to exercise
- not wanting to eat or not feeling hungry
- headache that is unusual or longer lasting than usual
- sore throat, stuffy or runny nose
- diarrhoea, feeling sick or being sick

If your child has any of the above symptoms and are generally unwell, they should not attend school. If your child has a high temperature, fever or chills, they should remain at home until their temperature has returned to normal. Typically, a child with a mild runny nose or infrequent cough, who is generally well, can attend school. If their wellness changes during their time school, you may be called to collect them.

If your child does test positive for Covid-19, the advice is that they remain at home for 3 days. For further advice, please refer to https://www.gov.uk/guidance/people-with-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19

Please find attached a sheet containing information about a range of common childhood illnesses which you may find useful. When calling to report a pupil absence, please be specific about the reason for their absence as this will help everyone to understand and offer appropriate guidance and advice. Comments such as 'a bit poorly', 'unwell' and similar are unhelpful and are to be avoided.

Selfless Shelves supporting the West Cheshire Foodbank

The children of class 4 think Capenhurst is a welcoming community that includes everyone irrespective of race, gender or religion. The 'Selfless Shelves' is a project where children can earn a token as a reward for a good deed in school. This token can then be exchanged for a food item from the 'Selfless Shelves' which can then be placed in the Foodbank. Everyone is encouraged to bring items for the shelves - the children see this as a 'Circle of Kindness'. The Foodbank will then use these items to support local families struggling to provide food for themselves.



We will continue to support the West Cheshire Foodbank in our traditional way and food items can be brought in and placed on the 'Selfless Shelves' or directly into the collection box. The Foodbank is particularly in need of tinned tomatoes, UHT milk, UHT juice, cereal bars, tinned fruit/desserts, custard, instant coffee (small jars), jams and spreads, instant mash/tinned potatoes, sweet treats/crisps. instant pasta/noodles, small boxes tea bags, tinned meats/fish.
