

Behaviour expectations addendum to usual behaviour policy
Covid-19 (September 2020 onwards)

Our 5 Golden Rules still apply and the traffic light system will continue to be used.

- Children (and their families) will maintain social distancing expectations at their allotted drop-off and pick time and location.
- Children will wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds, following the routine on the poster in place at each sink in school, when they first enter school
- Children will wash their hands as above each time they enter and leave their classroom, when visiting the toilet, before they leave to go home AND whenever directed to by a member of staff.
- Children can only socialise inside school with the other pupils in their class group and during outside playtimes, children in classes 1 and 2 will be together and children in classes 3 and 4 will be together.
- Children are to reduce the need to touch another child – avoid hugging, holding hands and similar.
- Children (where possible and at an age-appropriate level) are to maintain their distance from staff and avoid physical contact.
- Children are to follow the instructions of their teacher when moving around school.
- If you sneeze or cough then remember - '**catch it, bin it, kill it**' AND dispose of the tissue in the bin THEN wash your hands.
- Avoiding touching your mouth, nose and eyes with hands at all times during the school day
- Tell an adult if you are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus
- Equipment, such as water bottles and personal stationery items, is not to be shared. Toys and books may be shared but hands are to be washed before and after use.
- Children are to play in their allocated section of the playground and with their allocated set of outdoor toys.
- Children will use the toilet at allocated times and the visits will be supervised by a member of staff. Hand washing posters will be displayed near each sink and children will be expected to follow the instructions on these posters.
- Coughing or spitting at or towards any other person will not be tolerated! You will be removed from your group and may be sent home.
- In event of self-isolation, class isolation, whole school or local lockdown, children are to use remote learning activities and resources with same respect and follow the same guidelines as they would if they were in school.

It is understood that primary school children will struggle to maintain a distance of 2m from each other but you are expected (and will be supported and encouraged) to reduce this as much as possible AND to exercise excellent hand-washing and hygiene routines.
