### School photographs

These will take place on Friday 2nd October which is also PE day. As only the top half of a child's uniform is visible on the photograph, children are still expected to wear their PE joggers and trainers/pumps. They will need to wear their school polo t-shirt and red school jumper/cardigan on their top half. Hair will need to be tied back as PE will still take place and loose hair is not advisable for school generally and especially not for PE. There will be no sibling photos this year as explained in an email sent last week. Thank you for your cooperation with this change to the usual photo routines.

# Testing for Covid-19

It is important that if your child becomes unwell with any of the COVID-19 symptoms listed below that you get tested. Testing sites are available across Cheshire and Merseyside, with appointments for tests released daily throughout the day. However, a vast increase in demand has led to laboratories, which process the tests, being overwhelmed. This national issue has meant that bookings have been restricted by the Department of Health and Social Care.

At this time of such high demand it is crucial that **only** people who have **COVID-19 symptoms** book a test. These include:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

There is no need for members of a pupil's household to have a test, unless they are also symptomatic. If your child tests positive they should self-isolate and stay off school for 10 days. If the test comes back negative they can return to school if they no longer have symptoms and have been fever free for 48hrs.

As we head into the winter months pupils may feel unwell for example with a sore throat, stomach upset or a headache. These pupils **don't** need to book a test but may need to stay off school or college and seek medical advice through their GP or pharmacist as usual. Please do not attend A & E, other hospital facilities or GP Practices requesting a COVID test as they are not able to provide these

### Swimming Lessons for Class 4

Swimming lessons start tomorrow (Tuesday 29th September) for children in Class 4. The bus will be leaving school promptly at 9am. The schools swimming organiser at EPSV has asked that all children arrive 'pool ready' – wearing their swimming costume/trunks under their uniform. If your child forgets to arrive 'pool ready' then they will travel with their class to the swimming lesson and spectate. Don't forget to pack underwear and a towel for afterwards!

It is essential that all children arrive on time to school to avoid missing the bus to the lesson. Any children, who miss the bus, will have to return home until the rest of their class return from swimming as there will not be any staff available in school to supervise them.

#### Google classrooms at Capenhurst

Each child will have had their log-in details stuck into their reading record. This week the first piece of homework will be set using Google classrooms. Remember to log-in and have a go with your child. This is a new venture for school and may be unfamiliar to some families so we need to be patient and work together so that everyone can become more confident in its use. Any questions, please ask. ### Applying for school places

Parents with children in Year 6 and pre-school children due to start school in September 2021 are reminded that you are now able to apply for Year 7 and reception places online via the Council's website at <a href="https://www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/admissions">www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/admissions</a>

The deadline for high school applications is **October 31st 2020**. The local high schools have arranged virtual open evenings to help you choose the right school for your child and details of these are available on their websites.

For parents with children due to start primary school in September 2021, the closing date for admissions is **January 15th** 2021.
