It was with sadness that last week we all received the sad news that Queen Elizabeth II had died peacefully and the nation entered a period of mourning. As a school, we gathered together on Friday morning to respectfully think about and reflect on her life as our Queen, as well as give thanks for her long life and all the ways that she upheld her pledge to be devoted in service. This week the staff and children will spend time during reflection and worship thinking about the life of the Queen and what the future will hold for the new king - King Charles III.

Canon Steve offers an open invitation to members of the school community and their families to visit Holy Trinity Church and spend time in quiet prayer and contemplation, should they wish to. There will also be a Book of Condolence open in church for those who wish to offer their condolences in this way.

Following the announcement of the date of the Queens' funeral - Monday 19th September - I am confirming that school will be closed to all pupils and staff in line with guidance from the DfE and it being confirmed that the day will be a Bank Holiday. School will re-open on Tuesday 20th September as usual.

Selfless Shelves supporting the West Cheshire Foodbank - All in, bring a tin!

We think that Capenhurst is a welcoming community that includes everyone irrespective of race, gender or religion. The 'Selfless Shelves' is a project where children can earn a token as a reward for a good deed in school. This token can then be exchanged for a food item from the 'Selfless Shelves' which can then be placed in the Foodbank. Everyone is encouraged to bring items for the shelves - the children see this as a 'Circle of Kindness'. **We encourage families to help out over the next few days by bringing in things for the Selfless Shelves. All in, bring a tin!**



The Foodbank will then use these items to support local families struggling to provide food for themselves. We will continue to support the West Cheshire Foodbank in our traditional way and food items can be brought in and placed on the 'Selfless Shelves' or directly into the collection box. The Foodbank is particularly in need of **UHT milk, UHT juice, instant coffee** (small jars), instant mash/tinned potatoes, instant pasta/noodles, tinned meats/fish and tinned puddings.
