This week we have been listening to the voice of **Mary** who played such an important part in the coming of Jesus into the world. There is something special about the fact that God chose to come to earth as a baby. When Jesus became an adult he cared a lot about **children**. There were 4.1 million children living in poverty in the U.K. in 2017/18. That's 30% of children! We can reach out to the children and their families living in poverty by bringing donations for the foodbank as part our '**Giving Advent**' (see above and 4th page). Thank you to those families who filled a Christmas Shoebox for vulnerable children overseas.

Lord, thank you for the gift of Jesus who cares for all children. Bring protection and safety to children in need this advent. Amen.
